


# Triceratops Mask

Did you know

horned face?



A Triceratops may  
look threatening, but  
it was a herbivore  
(only ate plants)  
so it would not want  
to eat you!



## What to do

- Colour in and decorate the triceratops mask and horns.
- Cut around the triceratops mask and cut out the horn and eye holes.
- Fold the mask just below the eyes so the nose sticks up.
- Cut out all three horn nets.

- Assemble the horns by folding over the long tab and glueing it to the back of the other side of the net, making a cone shape.
- Fold the small tabs around the bottom of the cone outwards.
- Put glue on the top side of the tabs.
- Put the horns through the horn holes so the glued side of the tabs is sticking to the back of the mask.



- Press the tabs down so they stick securely.
- Make two holes over the two small circles on the Triceratops mask. Tie elastic or string to the holes to wear.
- Put on your mask and let us hear your best triceratops roar!
